Dear Ms. Cave:

I am in receipt of your letter dated October 15, 2007, requesting reconsideration of the panel's decision in the above-entitled matter. The right to reconsideration is only permitted following the dismissal of a complaint after a probable cause hearing.¹ Once an evidentiary hearing has been held and a final decision issued, the only recourse for an aggrieved party is to appeal to the Minnesota Court of Appeals under the judicial review provisions of the Minnesota Administrative Procedure Act.² The panel issued its final decision in this case on October 4, 2007.

You have also requested additional time in which to pay the \$1,000 civil penalty that was assessed against you. In its decision, the panel ordered that you pay the civil penalty by November 15, 2007. In your letter, you request that the fine be due after January 1, 2008, because of financial hardship.


Debts to the state are ordinarily payable within 30 days. Pursuant to Minnesota Statute § 16D.13, interest on the amount you owe will start to accrue after November 15, 2007. The rate of interest is established by the Department of Revenue

and is currently 8% per annum. Should your debt become 121 days past due, it must be referred to the Commissioner of Revenue for collection.³
